## Dear Northwest Kilters,

I was recently contacted regarding proposed new rules and regulations that could potentially limit kite flying on Oregon beaches in order to protect Snowy Plover habitat. This is actually an issue that has been in discussion for over a year now but a new series of hearings are underway at several locations along the coast and this has generated new interest and new concerns.

The Snowy Plover is an endangered bird species that nests in remote areas along the Northwest Coast. Oregon Parks and Recreation is considering rules to limit vehicles, mining, driftwood harvesting, horse riding, dogs, and some other activities in certain designated areas.

Kite flying is on the list. Apparently, some kites can resemble Plover predators. Flying kites in nesting areas can either discourage mating, or allow the birds to become complacent to the presence of predators.

It is important to understand that this is not a ban on all kiting on all Oregon beaches as some have suggested. Nesting areas are generally on remote spits and headlands. Nesting activity does not take place near towns or more populated beaches. For example, there are no proposed preservation areas in all of Lincoln County.

The AKA strongly resists restrictions on kiting in public spaces. In this case, I see no threat to the flying spaces we frequent. Individual kilters may choose to support or oppose these preservation proposals for a variety of reasons. But in my opinion, the impact on kite flying is negligible.

Changes in Board Positions


- Charly motioned for Dave Shattuck to be our new merchant liaison. Ken seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

- Current available board positions are Vice President, Web Master, Safety Officer, and Secretary.


WKA Web Site

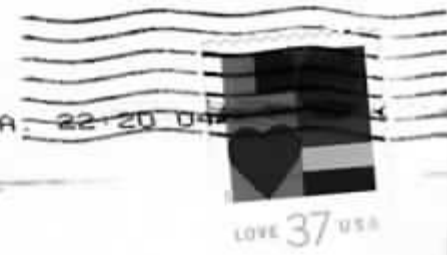
