Kite Festival

Come to WSIKF -- There is LOTS to do!!!

Washington State International Kite Festival, better known as WSIKF, is a full week of kite activities. And this year, the fun promises to be non-stop (provided that the weather cooperates).

Monday will, as usual, feature arches and trains. It will also be the day we host events for "special friends", helping them build and fly kites. These are children from area special needs programs, who come to share our fun.

Tuesday is one of the busiest days at the Washington State International Kite Festival. As in previous years, teams compete for points throughout the day in an effort to win the right for possession of the "Terrific Tuesday Top Team" banner for the coming year. Teams represent kite clubs, or groups of clubs, or groups of people formed for the specific purpose of

pursuing the banner, or . . . In past years, groups have pooled their resources to assure success. Teams are limited to 10 people, including the captain.

The first event of the day is called "Totally Tubular". As the name implies, this is a competition for tubes -- anything that attaches to a kite line and inflates and is semi-round. Categories include "The Tail Wags the Dog", "Spin Me Around 'til I'm Dizzy", "Trick Tubes", and "Go Figure".

This will be followed by the individual Rokkaku battle. Rules will be printed in the program for the festival.

Club Camps, an event which allows teams to show off their ground displays, will be judged before lunch. This change in schedule will allow

the inclusion later in the day of a team rok battle.

After lunch, there will be a "Circoflex Roundup". Then "Pun Fun" begins. This year's categories include "Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend", "Delta Dawn", "Dragon the Line/Hapi Together" (which is a combination of dragon kites and wearing a hapi coat), "Saturday Night's All Right for Fightin'", and "Crazy", and a new one 'Fallin' to Pieces", for quilted kites. Some categories will include "extra credit" items. This promises to be a lot of fun, as usual.

There will also be a new event, the single-line show-off, in the afternoon. The final event of the day is a team Rokkaku battle.

Wednesday's events will include the children's events in the morning, as well as the senior fighter kite fly. Afternoon events will include the fighter kite showcase and the senior ballet.

A new event this year is "Paint Me Patriotic", featuring red, white and blue in every possible form - kites, camps, line art, etc. More details will be worked out before the festival.

Thursday is handcrafted day. This is an opportunity for all kite builders, of all skill levels, to enter their work and be judged by a skilled panel of kite making experts. The categories and rules

follow the AKA rulebook. This will also include a record attempt for the most kites bigger than 252 square feet.

Friday begins the mass ascension events. The first one will be deltas and derivatives, and later in the day cellular kites will take to the air. Other events for the day include a quad line demo, a bargello mass fly, "Hot Tricks" which features sport kite fliers, and the memorial fly, to honor those who have passed on during the year. The day ends with a night fly and fireworks.

Saturday begins with mystery ballet, followed by the mass ascension for flat and bowed kites. Then comes the pin challenges, the rokkaku challenge, and Showtime, our parade of colors down the boardwalk and around the field. Not least, the final event of the day will be the Cody fly, an attempt to field the most Cody kites in one place at one time. Fireworks will again light up the sky at dusk.

Sunday will see the final mass ascension, for soft sparless kites. Later in the day, we all begin to say our goodbyes, and take our tired bodies and sand-covered kites home, to get ready for next year.

This event is the opportunity for kitefliers from everywhere to pay tribute to people who lost their lives or lost someone in their lives in the World Trade Center terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. You may participate by flying whatever kites you like. Although red-white-and-blue would be appreciated, the colors are not a limiting factor.

The idea is to fly kites in tribute and, hopefully, to tap the power that some say kites have in healing and soothing the soul, as well as beautifying the environment. This display will be a contrast to what the skies looked like approximately a year earlier to date. This is a grassroots effort, not a competition or money-making event.

We will need sport kite ballet demos, single-line kites, flow forms, air forms, etc. Liberty State Park has plenty of room for all. In the past few years, the park has expanded its lawn area tenfold. Situated directly across from lower Manhattan, the park boasts large grass fields, free parking, restrooms, and 360 degrees of unobstructed wind. Come join in this historic moment!

FANTASTIC FATHER'S DAY FLY



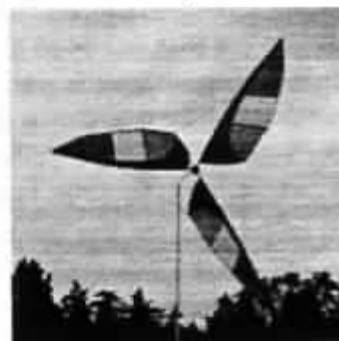
